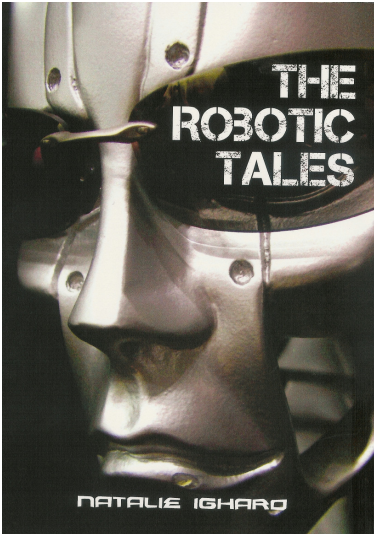


Teenage author Natalie Igharo to hold book signings
